Dear Parishioners:


Perseverance is an intriguing word. It originates from two Latin words meaning “to sever-thoroughly”- like running an obstacle course. The Gospel today tells the story of a Canaanite woman who possessed great perseverance. She had her goal firmly fixed in her mind, which was to obtain a miracle from Jesus for her daughter, who was possessed by an evil spirit.

Her cause did not look like it would succeed. She was a foreigner so the disciples encouraged her to leave them alone by giving her the silent treatment. Next came a blunt rejection, which was weathered equally well. Finally, she passed the third and hardest test of being insulted. This not only failed to deter her but provoked a malice-free retort which must have made Jesus smile.

“Have pity on me..... Help me Lord.” How could Jesus ignore anyone who spoke so sincerely? He couldn’t. He praised her and performed the miracle that she had so earnestly requested.

Here is a woman who refused to believe that her pleas were going to the dogs. She deeply believed in the Lord, but it was only through perseverance that she obtained her request. Such determination may or may not get us the things we work and pray for. But if we do come up on the short end, we are at least better people for having made the effort. “Thy will be done,” is also a God-inspired prayer of persevering trust in Him. The Lord is compassionate even when it seems He is not. We must be able to endure being ignored, rejected and hurt, for these are the real tests of perseverance. The Canaanite woman is a lesson to us all that faith, like love, only grows when it is tested. May we have her faith.

Notas del Párroco

Estimados Feligreses:

La perseverancia es una palabra intrigante. Se origina de dos palabras latinas que significan "cortar a fondo" - como recorrer una pista de obstáculos. El Evangelio de hoy cuenta la historia de una mujer cananea que poseía gran perseverancia. Ella tenía su meta firmemente fija en la mente: obtener un milagro de Jesús para su hija que estaba poseída por un espíritu maligno.

Parecía que su causa no tendría éxito. Ella era extranjera, así que los discípulos la animaban a dejarlos en paz por no hablarle. Luego vino un rechazo brusco, que fue resistido igualmente bien. Finalmente, pasó la tercera y más dura prueba, la de ser insultada. Esto no sólo no pudo disuadirla, sino que provocó una réplica-- libre de malicia que le habrá hecho sonreír a Jesús.

"Ten piedad de mí ... Ayúdame, Señor." ¿Cómo podría Jesús ignorar a alguien que hablara tan sinceramente? No lo pudo hacer. Él la alabó y realizó el milagro que ella tanto había pedido.

Aquí tenemos a una mujer que se negó a creer que sus súplicas se echarían a perder. Ella creía profundamente en el Señor, pero fue sólo a través de la perseverancia que obtuvo su petición. Tal determinación puede o no conseguirnos las cosas por las cuales trabajamos y oramos. Pero si nos quedamos cortos, o sea no logramos nuestros deseos, al menos somos mejores por haber hecho el esfuerzo. "Hágase tu voluntad," es también una oración inspirada por Dios. Es de la confianza perseverante en Él. El Señor es compasivo, incluso cuando parece que no lo es. Debemos ser capaces de aguantar ser ignorados, rechazados y heridos, porque éstos son las verdaderas pruebas de la perseverancia. La mujer cananea nos enseña que la fe, como el amor, sólo crece cuando se prueba. Que Dios nos dé la fe que ella tenía.

CALLED TO ACT IN GOD'S NAME

"Let all the nations praise you!" (Psalm 67:4) today's psalm response exclaims. In the psalms and other Hebrew scriptures, this kind of invocation is actually an invitation to God to act, to intervene in human lives in a manner that will cause everyone – not just the Chosen People – to give praise. Stated a bit more strongly, it is something of a "put up or shut up" challenge to God, the sort of strong statement the psalmists of Israel, trusting in their intimate and loving relationship with God, were not afraid to make.

The Gospel has its own exclamation, announcing the appearance of the Canaanite woman with "Behold!" (Matthew 15:22) "Behold!" is a scriptural flag that tells us that God is about to act or announce something through an individual or a situation. In the case of Jesus, God was going to act through this woman, whom nobody among Jesus' followers would have believed to be an agent of the divine will. Like the psalmists, we might passively inform or perhaps even actively challenge God to do something so that everyone will come to belief, but God will always turn the tables on us. It becomes our calling, our duty (as it was for Jesus) to behold the situations and persons of our daily lives so that God can act through us, so the Kingdom can be announced through our living.

UNA GOTITA DE CATECISMO

LLAMADOS A ACTUAR EN EL NOMBRE DE DIOS

"¡Que todos los pueblos te alaben!" (Salmo 67:4) exclama la respuesta del salmo e hoy. En el salterio y en otras escrituras hebreas, este tipo de invitación a Dios para que actúe e intervenga en las vidas humanas de tal manera que haga que todos no sólo el Pueblo Elegido -exprese alabanzas. Dicho algo más fuerte, es como desafiar a Dios para que "aguante o se calle", el tipo de palabras duras que los salmistas de Israel, confiando en su íntima relación de amor con Dios, no temían expresar.

El Evangelio tiene su propia exclamación que anuncia la aparición de la mujer cananea con un "Entonces" (Mateo 15:22). "Entonces" o "he aquí" es una señal en la Biblia que nos indica que observemos con mucha atención, que Dios está por actuar o anunciar algo por medio de un individuo o una situación. En el caso de Jesús, Dios iba a obrar a través de esta mujer, a quien ninguno de los seguidores de Jesús hubiera creído pudiera ser una agente de la voluntad divina. Como los salmistas, puede que informemos en forma pasiva a Dios o quizás hasta activamente le desafiemos para que haga algo para que todos lleguen a creer, mas Dios siempre nos volteará las posiciones. Se convierte en nuestro llamado, nuestro deber (como lo fue para Jesús) observar atentamente las situaciones y a las personas en nuestra vida diaria para que Dios pueda actuar a través de nosotros, para que el Reino sea anunciado en nuestro diario vivir.


