





While I hardly consider myself to be a world traveler I am blessed to have visited Italy, The Dominican Republic, Mexico and Peru. One thing that I observed in those places is the different pace of life and the attitude toward work. At lunch time businesses all close until about 3 PM to allow time for a siesta during the heat of day. There seems to be no hurry to get things done. If you were to ask why, you'd probably get a response like, "I work to live, I don't live to work."

In contrast, in the U.S. citizens take less vacation time than any other nation, the so called blue laws are all but disappearing and stress levels are on the rise with all the illnesses they cause, family life suffers and the cultural arts are less apt to flourish as they do elsewhere. And I might add that Mass attendance has dropped considerably.

Even God rested after creating the world and he gave us the sabbath to observe for the very purpose of rest. He should know what we need because he holds our blue print. In today's gospel the apostles have just returned from their first missionary journey amazed at what the Lord had done through them. The first thing he does is take them apart to an out of the way place. Why? They need to recharge their batteries, reflect on their experiences and share their faith. We call that a retreat, day of recollection or even Sunday Mass as the pause that refreshes. We should all take a vacation from our labors but never from the Lord! Have a restful and Blessed summer.

Notas del Pastor

Estimados feligreses:

Aunque no me considero un viajero del mundo, tengo la suerte de haber visitado Italia, La República Dominicana, México y Perú. Una cosa que he observado en esos lugares es el diferente ritmo de vida y la actitud hacia el trabajo. En las empresas a la hora del almuerzo todo se cierra hasta las 3:00 de la tarde para que haya tiempo para una siesta durante el día caluroso. No parece haber ninguna prisa para hacer las cosas. Si se le preguntara: ¿por qué?, probablemente recibirán una respuesta como, "yo trabajo para vivir, no vivo para trabajar".

Por el contrario, los ciudadanos norteamericanos toman menos tiempo de vacaciones que cualquier otra nación, la ley que prohíbe la realización de ciertas actividades los domingos casi desaparecen, y los niveles de estrés están en aumento con todas las enfermedades que causan, la vida familiar sufre y las artes culturales no florecen tanto como lo hacen en otras partes. Y debo de añadir que la asistencia a la Misa se ha reducido considerablemente.

Incluso, Dios descansó después de crear al mundo y él nos dio el sábado para observar con el propósito de descanso. Él debe saber lo que necesitamos porque él tiene nuestro proyecto original. How will the parish goals be determined? Parish goal calculations are based on 100 percent of the 2013, offertory (first collections) using the reported information for unrestricted plate and donations.

How much will my parish receive as part of this campaign? As part of the *We Are Living Stones* Capital Campaign, \$40 million will be allocated to help parishes meet their local needs. After the *Works of Mercy* target is met, 50% of all funds raised will stay at the parish for projects determined by local leadership.

Is our parish goal an assessment? No, the established parish goals are not an assessment. However, the first monies raised at each parish will be allocated to help meet the parish's "Works of Mercy" target. All parishes are asked to conduct a "good faith effort" and work with their assigned campaign director to achieve their goal. If, after conducting a "good faith effort" the parish does not meet its goal, the parish will not be assessed the balance.

When will parishes begin to receive their 50 percent share? Parishes in Block 1 can expect to receive their first distribution of 50% of monies collected in October of 2015. These payments will continue every quarter thereafter until the conclusion of the campaign. If the parish exceeds goal, they will receive 60% of all funds redeemed above the *We Are Living Stones* goal on the same timeline as stated above.

How will the campaign affect our parish offertory? In the short term, offertory giving should remain level, with a possible small fluctuation up or down. We make sure we communicate that parishioners are asked to consider a greater sacrifice and commitment to their Archdiocesan Church above and beyond their regular offertory giving, and should not lower their gifts to their parish in order to make a gift to this effort.

How Old Is Your Church?

If you are a Lutheran, your religion was founded by Martin Luther, an ex-monk of the Catholic Church, in the year 1517.

If you belong to the Church of England, your religion was founded by King Henry VIII in the year 1534 because the Pope would not grant him a divorce with the right to remarry.

If you are a Presbyterian, your religion was founded by John Knox in Scotland in the year 1560.

If you are a Protestant Episcopalian, your religion was an offshoot of the Church of England founded by Samuel Seabury in the American colonies in the 17th century.

If you are a Congregationalist, your religion was originated by Robert Brown in Holland in 1582.

If you are a Methodist, your religion was launched by John and Charles Wesley in England in 1744.

If you are a Unitarian, Theophilus Lindley founded your church in London in 1774.

If you are a Mormon (Latter Day Saints), Joseph Smith started your religion in Palmyra, N.Y., in 1829.

If you are a Baptist, you owe the tenets of your religion to John Smyth, who launched it in Amsterdam in 1605.

If you are of the Dutch Reformed church, you recognize Michaelis Jones as founder, because he originated your religion in New York in 1628.

If you worship with the Salvation Army, your sect began with William Booth in London in 1865.

If you are a Christian Scientist, you look to 1879 as the year in which your religion was born and to Mrs. Mary Baker Eddy as its founder.

If you belong to one of the religious organizations known as 'Church of the Nazarene,' "Pentecostal Gospel," "Holiness Church," "Pilgrim Holiness Church," "Jehovah's Witnesses," your religion is one of the hundreds of new sects founded by men within the past century.

If you are Catholic, you know that your religion was founded in the year 33 by Jesus Christ the Son of God, and it is still the same Church.

Quien Fundó Tu Iglesia?

Si tú eres luterano, tu iglesia la fundó Martín Lutero, un ex-monje católico en el año 1524.

Si tú eres anglicano, tu iglesia la fundó Enrique VIII en 1534 porque el Papa no le concedió el divorcio para poder casarse con Ana Bolena.

Si tú eres presbiteriano, tu iglesia la fundó Juan Knox en Escocia en el año de 1560.

Si tú perteneces a la Iglesia Episcopaliana, esta es una rama de la iglesia de Inglaterra fundada por Samuel Seabury en las colonias de Estados Unidos en 1785.

Si tú perteneces al grupo de los Testigos de Jehová, Carlos Taze Russell inició esta iglesia en Pensilvania en 1879.

Si tú eres metodista, tu religión fue organizada por J & C Wesley en Inglaterra en 1739, cuando decidió separarse de los anglicanos.

Si tu eres mormón (Santos de los Últimos Días), José Smith inició este grupo en Palmyra, N.Y. en 1830.

Si tú eres bautista, los orígenes de tu iglesia se remontan al año 1609 cuando a John Smith se le ocurrió fundar esta religión.

Si tú eres unitario, Teófilo Lindley fundó tu iglesia en Londres en 1774.

Si tú eres adventista del Séptimo día, este movimiento lo inició Guillermo Miller, un granjero americano bautista. La iglesia se organizó posteriormente hacia 1860.

Si tú perteneces al Ejército de Salvación, tu grupo lo comenzó Guillermo Booth en Londres en 1865.

Si tú te afilias con los de Ciencia Cristiana, tu religión se remonta a 1879 cuando María Baker Eddy decidió que necesitábamos una nueva religión.

Si tú perteneces a la Iglesia Pentecostal o Asambleas de Dios, estas iglesias cristianas comenzaron alrededor de 1914 en Hot Springs, Arkansas.


Si perteneces a cualquier otro grupo religioso del tipo "Evangélicos", "Iglesias de Dios", "Iglesia apostólica" o "Iglesia de Cristo", esos grupos se fundaron no hace más de cincuenta años.

Si tú eres católico, tu Iglesia la fundó Jesucristo el día de Pentecostés en el año 33. Lee: Mateo 16,18-19 y Hechos 2.

Nosotros nos sentimos unidos a todos los que se honran con el nombre de cristianos. Lee: *Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica* = CIC 817 ss. Precisamente porque todos los cristianos queremos la unidad, debemos cuidarnos de los que nos cortan y dividen, "los sectarios". A éstos, con la Biblia en la mano, puedes responder lo siguiente: ¡HAY UNA SOLA IGLESIA! La Iglesia Católica.

La Biblia enseña que Jesucristo fundó una y única Iglesia. El dijo a Pedro: "Tú eres Pedro y sobre esta piedra edificaré mi Iglesia". Lee: Mateo 16,18. Y no dijo: "Sobre este pedregal edificaré mis iglesias." A Jesucristo no le gustan las divisiones, El quiere la unidad. Lee: Juan 17,21.
