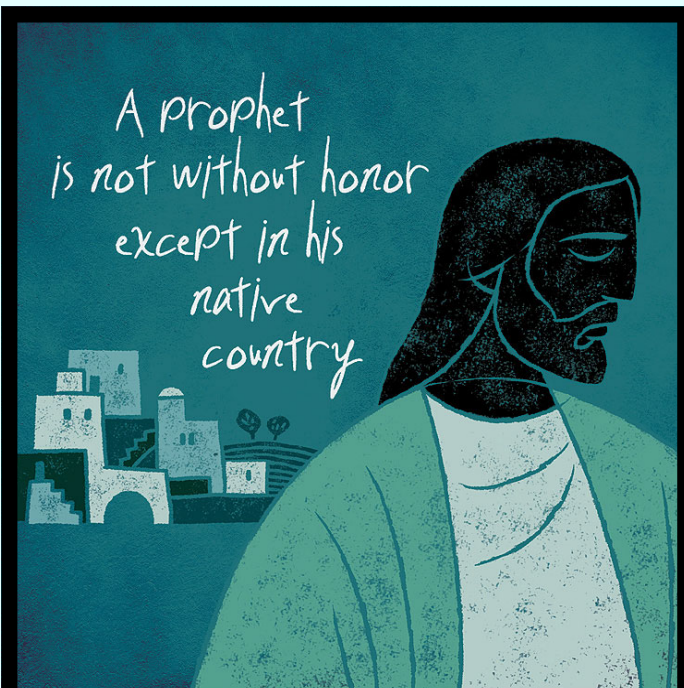

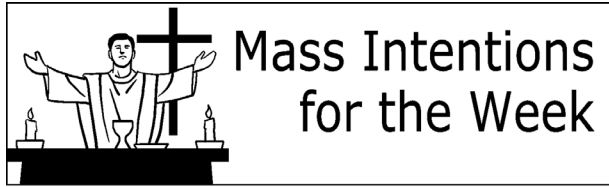

Dear Parishioners:

“Where did this man get all this?...” “Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary...?” In today’s gospel we hear of Jesus’ visit to the synagogue in his home town of Nazareth. We are told that all who heard him were astonished by his wisdom. Why, then, were they ready to hurl him to his death before his departure from the town?

The word “expert” has been defined as “one who lives at least one hundred miles away.” It echoes the words of Jesus who says, “A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house.” Why is this the case? I can still remember my seminary professors telling us to never minister to our own families. It would never bode well because we were too close to the fire. They were right. The few times I attempted to counsel my own family I failed miserably. It is because it is impossible for us to separate our negative impressions of a person from their words. If we are prejudiced against them they can do nothing right and if we are prejudiced for them they can do no wrong.

I find it interesting that Jesus is present as the Son of Mary because usually a man was known as the son (Bar) of his father. Mark is telling us that clearly Jesus was not just a carpenter and Mary was not just another woman. He is a voice to be reckoned with and listened to, God in the flesh. May we always be open to the Wisdom of God regardless of the messenger who bears it to us. Hey, you never know who they might really be.

## Notas del Pastor

Estimados feligreses:

"¿De dónde consiguió este hombre todo esto? ..." "¿No es él el carpintero, el hijo de María ...?" En el evangelio de hoy nos enteramos de la visita de Jesús a la sinagoga de su ciudad natal de Nazaret. Se nos dice que todos los que lo oyeron se asombraron por su sabiduría. ¿Por qué, entonces, estaban ellos listos para lanzarlo a la muerte antes de su salida de la ciudad?

La palabra "experto" se ha definido como: "él que vive por lo menos a una distancia de cien millas." Se hace eco de las palabras de Jesús que dice: "No hay profeta sin honra sino en su tierra y entre sus parientes y en su propia casa." ¿Por qué es este el caso? Todavía me acuerdo de mis profesores del seminario que nos decían nunca ministráramos a nuestras propias familias. Nunca auguraría nada bueno porque estábamos demasiado cerca del fuego. Tenían razón. Las pocas veces que intenté darles consejos a los de mi propia familia fracasé miserablemente. Es debido a que es imposible separar nuestras impresiones negativas de una persona de sus palabras. Si tenemos prejuicios contra ellos no pueden hacer nada bien y si tenemos preferencia por ellos, no pueden hacer ningún mal.

Me parece interesante que Jesús está presente como el Hijo de María, porque por lo general un hombre era conocido como el hijo (Bar) de su padre. Marcos nos dice que claramente Jesús no era más que un carpintero y que María no era más que otra mujer. Debemos tener en cuenta su voz y escucharla. Es Dios encarnado. Que siempre nos mantengamos abiertos a la Sabiduría de Dios, independientemente de quién nos lleve el mensaje. Nunca se sabe quién puede ser en realidad.

**How will the parish goals be determined?** Parish goal calculations are based on 100 percent of the 2013, offertory (first collections) using the reported information for unrestricted plate and donations.

**How much will my parish receive as part of this campaign?** As part of the *We Are Living Stones* Capital Campaign, \$40 million will be allocated to help parishes meet their local needs. After the *Works of Mercy* target is met, 50% of all funds raised will stay at the parish for projects determined by local leadership.

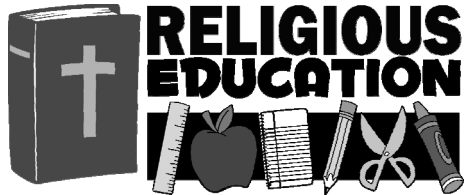
**Is our parish goal an assessment?** No, the established parish goals are not an assessment. However, the first monies raised at each parish will be allocated to help meet the parish's "Works of Mercy" target. All parishes are asked to conduct a "good faith effort" and work with their assigned campaign director to achieve their goal. If, after conducting a "good faith effort" the parish does not meet its goal, the parish will not be assessed the balance.

**When will parishes begin to receive their 50 percent share?** Parishes in Block 1 can expect to receive their first distribution of 50% of monies collected in October of 2015. These payments will continue every quarter thereafter until the conclusion of the campaign. If the parish exceeds goal, they will receive 60% of all funds redeemed above the *We Are Living Stones* goal on the same timeline as stated above.

**How will the campaign affect our parish offertory?** In the short term, offertory giving should remain level, with a possible small fluctuation up or down. We make sure we communicate that parishioners are asked to consider a greater sacrifice and commitment to their Archdiocesan Church above and beyond their regular offertory giving, and should not lower their gifts to their parish in order to make a gift to this effort.

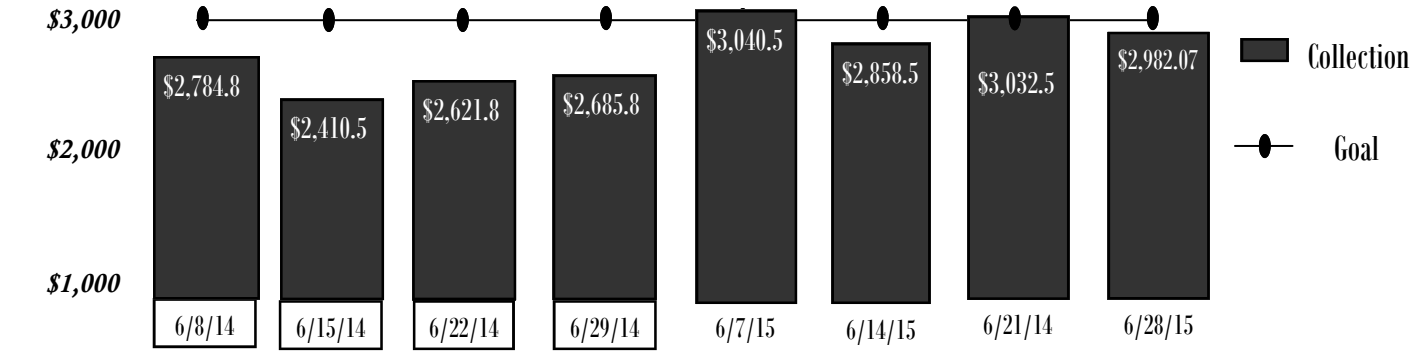
