

Dear Parishioners:

May the light and life of Jesus, our Risen Lord, fill your hearts and homes as we celebrate his victory over death.

Much of my undergraduate studies were spent reading anthologies of world literature in preparation for my certification as an English and history teacher here in New Jersey.

Often the lives and inspirations of authors were just as interesting as their writings. Such was the case of Gerard Manly Hopkins of Great Britain. Born the first of nine children on July 28, 1844, he converted from the Anglican faith, like our neighbors at St. Anthony's, in order to become catholic. None other than St. John Henry Newman inspired him by his own conversion and then received him into our Church.

On December 08, 1875, the German ship, the Deutschland, sank off the coast of England drowning 157 people. Among them were five Franciscan sisters who were traveling to Missouri on a mission to teach those immigrants from their native land. Survivors gave testimony that they sacrificed themselves to allow others to be saved. As the waters rose they held hands and prayed, "O Christ, O Christ, come quickly."

Hopkins, who had since become a Jesuit, was deeply moved by what he heard and so wrote "The Wreck of the Deutschland." In his poem he says, "Let him easter in us, be a day spring to the dimness of us....." These words touched me because I come from a family who spent many a summer day sailing on the river in the Hudson Valley. He used Easter, the English word for the Lord's rising, as a verb. It is a nautical term along with stern, bow, come about etc. It means to steer a craft eastward, into the light where the sun rises.

This festival calls us not to just celebrate an event of the past but, rather to redirect our life course into the light that is Christ. No matter what the circumstance or storm that envelopes us, there is a glorious conclusion. May his peace be yours, Alleluia!

PASIÓN


