Sacred Scripture and Secular Franciscans

Rule Article 4

The rule and life of the Secular Franciscans is this: to observe the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ by following the example of Saint Francis of Assisi, who made Christ the inspiration and the center of his life with God and people6. Christ, the gift of the Father's love, is the way to him, the truth into which the Holy Spirit leads us, and the life which he has come to give abundantly.

Secular Franciscans should devote themselves especially to careful reading of the gospel, going from gospel to life and life to the gospel.

Constitutions: Article 9.2

The secular Franciscan, committed to following the example and the teachings of Christ, must personally and assiduously study the Gospel and Sacred Scripture. *The fraternity and its leaders should foster love for the word of the Gospel and help the brothers and sisters to know and understand it* as it is proclaimed by the Church with the assistance of the Spirit.

Constitutions: Article 7.2

The preparation of the brothers and sisters for spreading the Gospel message "in the ordinary circumstances of the world" and for collaborating in the catechesis within the ecclesial communities should be promoted in the fraternities.

Constitutions: Article 44.3

Ongoing formation – accomplished by means of courses, gatherings, and the sharing of experience – aims to assist the brothers and sisters: —in listening to and meditating on the Word of God, "going from Gospel to life and from life to Gospel";

Gospel means the Lord Jesus himself. (Lk 2:10; Gal 1:16)

Gospel means the doctrine or teaching of good news. (Mt 24:14)

Gospel means the written book. (Rom 16:25)

Gospel means a program of life. ("Going from gospel to life and life to the gospel.")

This month we will read together two gospel passages having to do with mercy: The Parable of the Persistent Widow (Luke 18: 1-8) and the Parable of the Rich Official (Luke 12: 13-21).

As we read we will follow Lectio Divina (below).

Lectio Divina

- Read [Lectio] (Read the scripture passage)—We will read the passage aloud.
- Reflect [Meditatio] (Think about the passage—what words stand out—what is God telling us? We will say the words that strike us out loud—no discussion.)
- Respond [Oratio] (Allow our hearts to respond to God. This is inspired by our response to the Word of God. We will pray over the Scripture passages in silence.)
- Rest [Contemplatio] (We put aside our own thoughts and listen with our hearts to the message of
 the scripture passage. We are gradually <u>transformed</u> by the message. What is our response to God.
 We will sit quietly for a few moments to reflect on this.)

What are your favorite Gospel passages? Please write the references on a slip of paper to hand in at the meeting. As the year goes on, we will use these passages for reading and meditation.

Directions to Convivenza Sacred Heart Church 127 Paterson Avenue, Wallington, NJ

Take **Route 17 South** to Hoboken Rd. Turn Right onto Hoboken Rd. which becomes Paterson Ave. Church is on Right about 1 mi-- just past Dankoff Ave.

OR (No Highway)

From Lodi Street, make a left onto Polifly Road.

Continue on Polifly which will become Terrace Avenue in Hasbrouck Heights and then Hackensack Avenue in Wood-Ridge.

Continue on Hackensack Avenue. When you enter Carlstadt, look for St. Joseph's Church on your left. <u>At that corner, make a right onto Hoboken Road.</u>

Continue straight on Hoboken Road—about two miles. Hoboken Road becomes Paterson Avenue. You will see Sacred Heart Church just after passing Dankoff Avenue on the right.
