

Rule Chapter 2: Articles 10-11 (Alessandra will lead the discussion.)

Please read Chapter 2: Articles 10-11 in your white Rule booklets.

Then read the commentary below. (Or in your white booklets. Please mark portions that stand out to you.)

Article 10:

+Re-read article 10 of the Rule in your white booklet:

COMMENTARY: The first phase of evangelizing shows how the Secular Franciscans live in this world (Articles.10–12). Those who go "from gospel to life" have simple living (10–12), ...

Simple living begins with the choice to unite with Christ so intensely that one is willing to share even his passion: the burdens of hardship and pain within oneself or from outside sources.

--DISCUSSION: What are the "circumstances" of your life?

- How does the fulfillment of your responsibilities reflect your relationship with Jesus?
- How can you simplify your life so that living the gospel becomes possible?

Article 11:

+Re-read article 11 of the Rule in your white booklet:

COMMENTARY: Simple living also takes shape (11) by reducing material needs, by curbing a thirst for possessions and the domineering power that comes from ownership, and by using all God's gifts in a spirit of generosity, justice, and moderation. Gospel poverty for Secular Franciscans, then consists in acquiring possessions justly, keeping needs to a minimum, and using what they have as custodians for the generous benefit of others. In this way they live for the kingdom of God and not for this world, according to the charter for happiness given in the "Beatitudes."


