

OFS Rule: Chapter 2: Art. 7

- United by their vocation as "brothers and sisters of penance," and
 motivated by the dynamic power of the gospel, let them conform their
 thoughts and deeds to those of Christ by means of that radical interior
 change which the gospel itself calls "conversion." Human frailty makes it
 necessary that this conversion be carried out daily.
- On this road to renewal the <u>sacrament of reconciliation</u> is the <u>privileged</u> sign of the <u>Father's mercy</u> and the source of grace.

Also see Article 13 of the General Constitutions

- Conversion is symbolized as a <u>JOURNEY of TRANSFORMATION</u> led by the Spirit of God
- · Communal experience—encouragement and witness
- On-going process, celebrated in stages with Eucharist as highpoint
- · Conversion is a <u>lifetime experience</u> of transformation




